## 1. COURSE TITLE - Acrylic Painting II - Arts 15B-3 Units

2. COURSE DESCRIPTION - A continuation of Arts 15A with further emphasis on basic techniques that relate to the unusual characteristics of the
medium. Surfaces other canvas will be introduced allowing for more varied results.
3. PREREQUISITES: Arts 15A

Advisory: EWRT 211 and READ 211 (or LART 211), or ESL 272 and 273.

-Student will reproduce basic acrylic painting techniques to create a variety of paintings that draw from an objective point of view using
still-lifes and photographs as well as from the imagination.

variations in their work.

## 4. COURSE OBJECTIVES:

1. Explore the use of various acrylic mediums, gels, pastes, pigments and their applications on both two dimensional and three-dimensional surfaces.
2. Prepare studies for conceptual works.
3. Explore color recipes in applied color theory related to theme.
4. Broaden the range of skill used in painting.
5. Apply knowledge of studio needs and practices to ongoing purchases of essential art materials.
6. Demonstrate aesthetic growth through decision making processes.
7. Compare and contrast works of art from a global perspective.
8. Visit an art museum/gallery and write about applications of color, composition, context and content by a specific artist.
9. METHODS: Instructor demonstration, discussion of materials, class lectures, slide presentations of relevant painting styles past and present,
individual projects, personal and group critiques.
10. GRADING: Evaluation will be based primarily on the completion of all assigned studio projects. Important additional consideration will be given to
participation in class discussions and critiques approximately every three (3)
weeks. You must present at least one finished painting for each
critique.
Written evaluation: Submit a one-page written evaluation of your work at each critique. You may discuss the selection of the image, the process
and technique as well as the problems you encountered and overcame, or not, in your paintings.
